


How to find TOG Online


You can access TOG online following these steps.

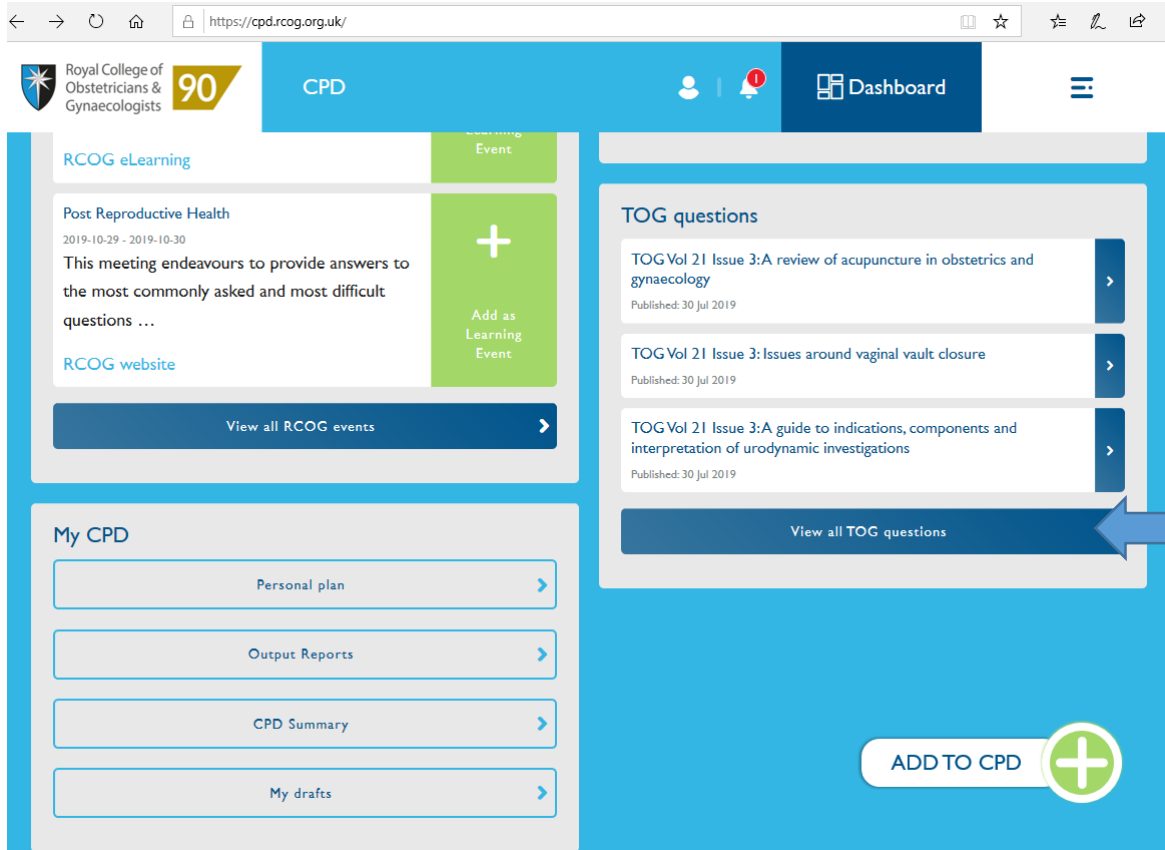

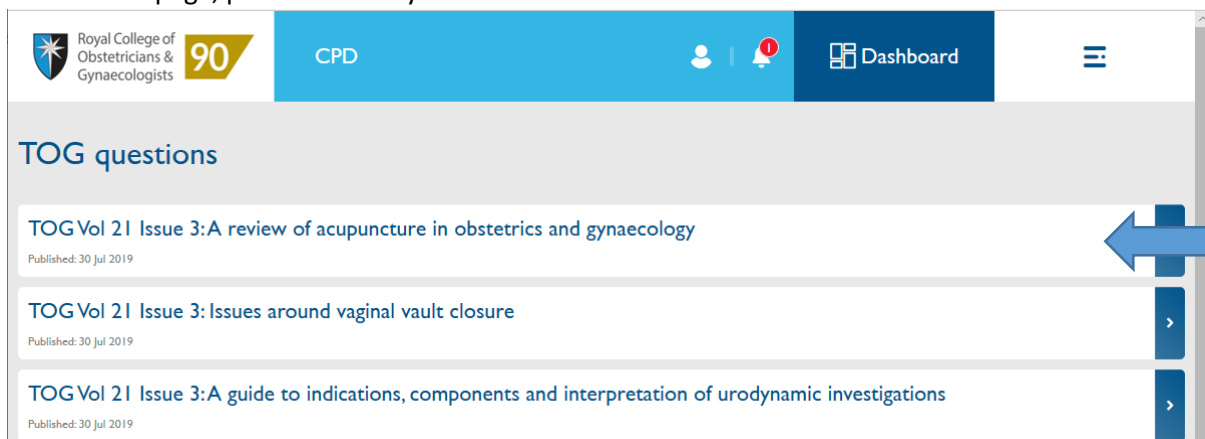
